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**Abstract\*** This workshop will inform attendees about the APPIC/APA sponsored journal, Training and Education in Professional Psychology (TEPP) and its place in the range of professional and scientific journals in psychology. The workshop will cover (a) the specific mission and needs for information by trainers about the educational processes for the field of professional and health service psychology, (b) the range of potential topics at all levels of the training sequence (doctoral, internship, and postdoctoral levels, as well as integrated sequences), and (c) the submission and editorial processes for consideration of manuscripts in TEPP. The workshop will be most relevant to those who have developed innovative and creative strategies and seek to share their developments to provide a stronger evidence-base for the field and to enhance competencies development from doctoral, internship and postdoctoral programs.
